

Unit I : - Teaching Learning Process

(TEACHING)

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Teaching is a process which provides knowledge and experience to its learners. Teaching is a two way process, which includes - teacher & student. It is also a bipolar process which includes - teacher, student and curriculum in it.

Raiburn, "Teaching is a relationship which helps the child to develop his powers."

Clark, "Teaching refers to activities that are designed and performed to produce the change in student's behaviour."

Jackson, "Teaching is a face to face encounter between two or more persons, one of whom (the teacher) intends to affect certain changes in the other participants (students)"

In the above definitions, we can see that there is a relation between teacher (teaching) and student (learning). i.e. We can say that teaching is a two way process and it is teaching learning process.

Thomas Green, in his book 'Activities of Teaching' he defines - "No teaching is possible without learning."

The teaching may aim at learning but the entire teaching process may not result into learning.

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Teaching and learning is a process that includes many variables. These variables interact as learners work towards their goals and incorporate new knowledge, behaviour and skills that add to their range of learning process.
