Course Objective: Actual politics in India diverges quite significantly from constitutional legal rules. An inderstanding of the political process thus calls for a different mode of analysis—that offered by political sociology. This course maps the working of modern institutions, premised on the existence of an individuated society, in a context marked by communitrian solidarities, and their mutual transformation hereby. It also familiarizes students with the working of the Indian state, paying attention to the contradictory dynamics of modern state power.
