The second wave of flood in Assam which occurred in July 2017 affected 17, 43, 119 population across 26 district. 86,223.19 hectares of crop area was affected in 2450 villages under 81 revenue circles with official death figures rising to 83 till July 30th. 123 relief camps and 259 relief distribution centre's were operational as on 13th July 2017. In the event of the emergency crisis Silapathar College organized a flood relief camp at Putabil, Nowboicha, Lakhimpur in order to help the flood affected people. All the faculty members of the college and students union members went for a flood relief camp on 24th July, 2017 at At Putabil, Nowboicha, Lakhimpur, Assam. FIELD STUDY CUM HISTORICAL TRIP TO LIKABALI/MALINI THAN ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE

On 19th January, 2018, Mr. Sivanath Pait, Assistant Professor, department of History took the students of History department, Silapathar College, Silapathar to Likabali's archaeological site of Malini Than temple for a Field visit. The group started at 7.30 a.m. When they reached, the professor explained the students that the excavation had begun in 1968 and ended in 1971 where valuable Hindu scriptures were discovered. He also narrated the local legend surrounding the site. The students studied the icons of deities, animal motifs, floral designs, curved columns and panels, the sculpture and relics and ascended the flight of steps where a small but neat museum houses various artifacts and photographs. They were guided by those in the museum. Having seen all the photos and sculptures from 13th to 19th century, the students descended to the valley once more, took their packet lunch and returned to Silapathar around 5. 30 pm. It was a successful trip.

A SOCIO-ECONOMIC STUDY ON THE GALO COMMUNITY OF ARUNACHAL PRADESH: WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO DHEMAJI DISTRICT

The department sociology organized a field study on 19th January, 2018 on the above mentioned topic. Through the field study, the study aimed to a) explore the socio-economic conditions of the Galo community on one hand, and b) giving basic practical knowledge about how research is actually done on the other. The intensive field-survey was done by students of B.A 5th Semester on household basis accompanied by the Faculties of the Department. In this study both the primary and secondary data have been used. The primary data were collected by conducting face to face interviews with the individual through interview schedules. The respondents were interviewed individually and separately so that they would not feel hesitant to talk about their socio-economic condition in presence of other persons. To examine intensity of the problems the case study method was applied. After the completion of the survey, the students were asked to submit a report on the findings of the study within a month.

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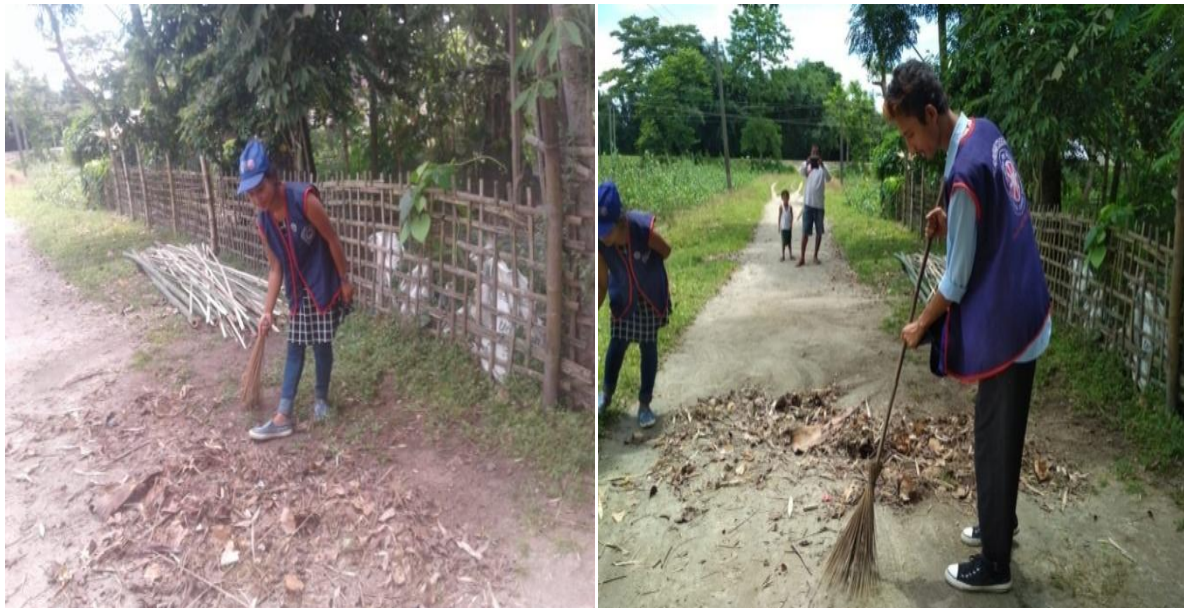

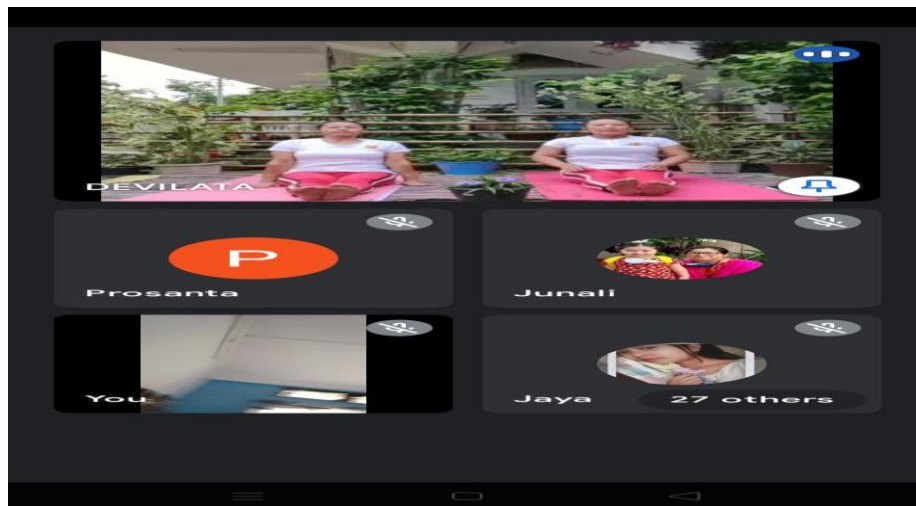

**A SOCIO-ECONOMIC STUDY ON BANAI TRIBE
WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO DHEMAJI DISTRICT OF ASSAM**

On February 22, 2022, the department of sociology organized an extension activity cum field survey in Kecha Kathoni Village, Jiadhalmuk, Dhemaji to learn more about the socio-political, socio-historical, socio-cultural, and socio-economical situation of the Banai Tribe. The concerned field study has conducted with the objective of giving basic practical knowledge about how research is actually done. With emphasis on formulating research design, methods of data collection, and data analysis, it will provide students with some elementary knowledge on how to conduct both, quantitative and qualitative research. The intensive field-survey was done by students of B.A 6th Semester on household basis accompanied by the faculties of the department. A total of 20 household were interviewed. The data were collected by conducting face to face interviews with the individual through interview schedules. After the completion of the survey, the students were asked to submit a report on the findings of the study within a month.

AN ECONOMIC STUDY ON THE HAJONG COMMUNITY OF ASSAM WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO DHEMAJI DISTRICT

The department of Economics organized a field survey on 22nd February, 2022 on the above mentioned topic. Through the field survey, the study aimed to a) explore the economic conditions of the Hajong community on one hand, and b) orient the students regarding research activities on the other. The Hajongs are the least studied ethnic tribe having a trans-border international existence in North-East India and in Bangladesh. Among the N.E states, Hajongs are scattered in Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya and Mizoram. Particularly in Assam, Hajong community villages are dotted in the districts of Darrang, Barpeta, Dhemaji, Goalpara, Lakhimpur, Nagaon, Nalbari, and DimaHasao. Emphasising the feasibility of the survey, remote KesaKathonigaon of Jiadhalmukh, Dhemaji district was selected randomly as the study area to fulfil the objectives. The village was inhabited homogeneously by the Hajong people. The intensive field-survey was done by students of B.A 3rd Semester on household basis accompanied by the Faculties of the Department. The survey was conducted through a structured household questionnaire fulfilling the pre-defined objectives. After the completion of the survey, the students were asked to submit a report on the findings of the study within a month.

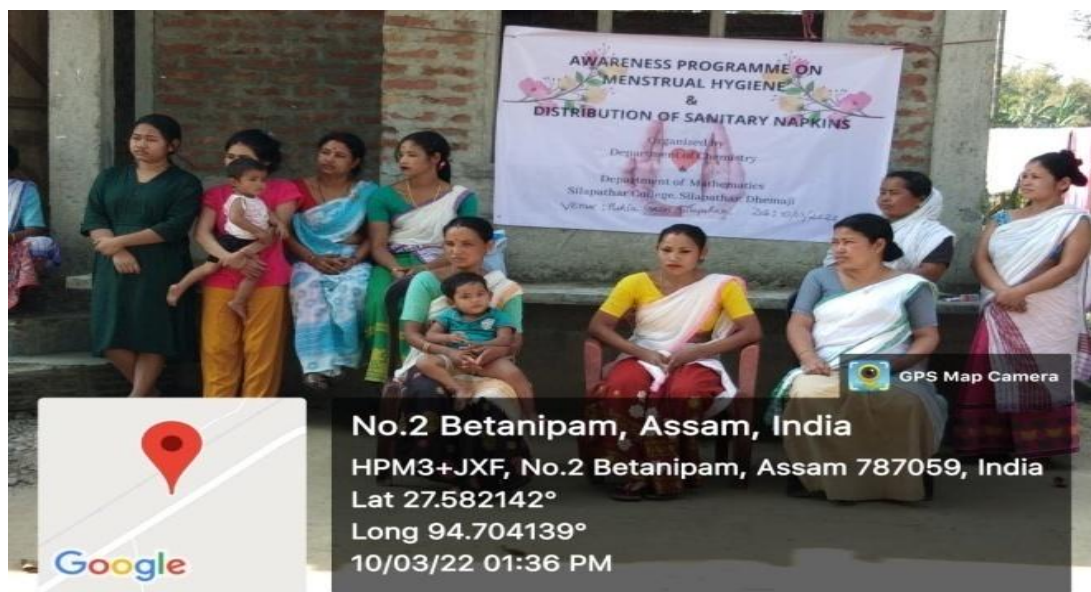
