Somosree Roy, an Analytics Professional and Ex-JNUite from Kolkata delivered a motivational speech on gender sensitivity on 21.01.22. On January 22, 2022, a poster making competition was organised on the theme "Gender and Domestic Abuse to generate awareness on gender equality through visual means. (b) National Girls Child Day was organised on 24.01.22 in Silapathar Town Girls' High School as an extension activity of this gender awareness programme. Somosree Roy (AnalyticsProfessional), Dr. Nabanita Baruah (Assistant Professor of Sociology), Mrs. Anindita Chakravarty (Assistant Professor of Economics) and Miss Madhusmita Devi (Assistant Professor of Political Science) delivered their powerful speeches on the National Child Day by sharing their valuable ideas on this important issue of today's time. (c) Department of Physics in collaboration with IQAC, Silapathar College organized an outreach program on "Popularization of science and its career prospects" on February 3, 2022 at Silapathar Senior Science Secondary School. The primary objective of the program was to build a scientific temperament among the students in the vicinity of Silapathar. The cocoordinator of IQAC, Silapathar College, Mr. Raju Pegu initiated the program with an introduction of Silapathar College. The faculties of the department of Physics, Dr. Happy Borgohain, Dr. Dilip Saikia and Mr. Kalyan Malakar discussed and interacted with the students about the importance of Science education and various careers they can opt for a successful career in Science. The students took active participitation and interacted with the teachers, cleared their queries and about various practical application of Science. (d) On February 22, 2022, the department of sociology organized an extension activity cum field survey in Kecha Kathoni Village, Jiadhalmuk, Dhemaji to learn more about the socio-political, socio-historical, sociocultural, and socio-economical situation of the Banai Tribe. The concerned field study has conducted with the objective of giving basic practical knowledge about how research is actually done. With emphasis on formulating research design, methods of data collection, and data analysis, it will provide students with some elementary knowledge on how to conduct both, quantitative and qualitative research. The intensive field-survey was done by students of B.A 6th Semester on household basis accompanied by the faculties of the department. A total of 20 household were interviewed.The data were collected by conducting face to face interviews with the individual through interview schedules. After the completion of the survey, the students were asked to submit a report on the findings of the study within a month. (e) The department of Economics organized a field survey on 22nd February, 2022 on the above mentioned topic. Through the field survey, the study aimed to a) explore the economic conditions of the Hajong community on one hand, and b) orient the students regarding research activities on the other. The Hajongs are the least studied ethnic tribe having a trans-border international existence in North-East India and in Bangladesh. Among the N.E states, Hajongs are scattered in Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya and Mizoram. Particularly in Assam, Hajong community villages are dotted in the districts of Darrang, Barpeta, Dhemaji, Goalpara, Lakhimpur, Nagaon, Nalbari, and DimaHasao. Emphasising the feasibility of the survey, remote KesaKathoniGaon of JiadhalMukh, Dhemaji district was selected randomly as the study area to fulfil the objectives. The village was inhabited homogenously by the Hajong people. The intensive field-survey was done by students of B.A 3rd Semester on household basis accompanied by the Faculties of the Department. The survey was conducted through a structured household questionnaire fulfilling the pre-defined objectives. After the completion of the survey, the students were asked to submit a report on the findings of the study within a month. (f) The Department of Mathematics, Silapathar College an initiative towards removing the phobia towards Mathematics at School level on 24/02/2022 at Mechaki Tongani High School

and Dibrugarh Missing Higher Secondary School. All the faculties of Mathematics department were present and interacted with the students. The HoD of the department graced the occasion. The principal as well as staff members of the school were present in the meeting. (g) Department of Zoology in collaboration with NSS unit of Silapathar College, Environment and Climate Cell of Silapathar College and Save Poba Rain Forest (NGO) organized a cleanliness drive program at Poba Rain forest on 27th February, 2022. (o) The NSS Unit of Silapathar College had organized a seven days special camp at the adopted village Kulajan Pam, Silapathar from 11th May to 17th May, 2022. The main purpose of the camp was to make the communities in village aware about certain important issues of the present era. During the seven days camp, various activities like

cleaning, plantation, blood grouping, distribution of dustbin, etc. were done. Thirty students participated in the said programme headed to Mr. Raju Pegu. (p) The department of Physics, Silapathar College has organized free coaching classes for the benefit of the students of the vicinity of Silapathar as a part of outreach program. The coaching classes are basically for the students of class 11 and class 12. It includes preparation for entrance exams like NEET, JEE etc and for board exams. The duration is for three months. The classes started from April 26, 2022. It was inaugurated by Mr. Raju Pegu, Coordinator, IQAC, Silapathar College. He delivered an inaugural address for the students. (q) On May 19, 2022, at approximately 11.30 a.m., the Silapathar College hosted a flood alleviation camp at Jamuguri Village in the Dhemaji District of Assam to raise awareness and provide food and other necessities to those affected by the flooding. Food and other necessities were given out to up to 50 families (rice, daal, potato, mustard oil, onion, sugar, tea, biscuits, detergent, water etc.). Participants in the aid camp included Dr. L. N. Pegu, Principal, Silapathar College, and other faculties viz. Mr. Raju Pegu, the IQAC coordinator at Silapathar College, Dr. Abdul Mutalib, an assistant professor, and Mr. Manash Pratim Dutta, an assistant professor. They also included students from the students union and Silapathar College's NSS volunteers. (r)Apart from conducting formal courses of learning in the subject, the department organizes several activities to inculcate leadership qualities as well as to promote experimental learning among students. The participation of the faculty and the students on a regular basis in those activities makes the Department dynamic and vibrant. B.A. 2nd, 4th and 6th Semester students of the academic year-2021-2022 were organised Educational Tour to Tai Studies and Research Centre Moranhat on 29th May, 2022. (s) The department of sociology visited No. 2 Gheyari (Dolungkang) village of Dhemaji district to conduct a field study on the topic " A Study on the Socio-Economic Life of Flood Affected People" as to fulfill the course requirement of B.A. 6th Semester on May 31st, 2022. The concerned field study has conducted with the objective of giving basic practical knowledge about how research is actually done. With emphasis on formulating research design, methods of data collection, and data analysis, it will provide students with some elementary knowledge on how to conduct both, quantitative and qualitative research. The intensive field-survey was done by students of B.A 6th Semester on household basis accompanied by the Faculties of the Department. A total of 40 household were interviewed. The data were collected by conducting face to face interviews with the individual villagers through interview schedules. After the completion of the survey, the students were asked to submit a report on the findings of the study within a month. This field study conducted for the partial fulfillment of the requirement for Research Project (Core Course 14: Research Methods II) mentioned in the curriculum. (t) The Eco Club and the department of Sociology, Silapathar College, observed "World Environment Day 2022" in the collaborative school premises on June 5th. Dr. Abdul Mutalib, Assistant Professor and Coordinator of "Eco Club" of Silapathar College, graced the occasion as chief guest. The day started with an awareness programme followed by a plantation drive at the school premises. A total of 10 indigenous saplings were planted in and around the collaborative school campus. The president of the SMC, village headman, teachers, and students of the school actively participated in the event. (u) On June 5th, 2022, the NSS Unit Cell in collaboration with the Environment and Climate \$\preceq\$#8223; and the Eco Club. Silapathar College, Silapathar, a plantation drive was done on the road side areas of Bhalukaguri Dambuk, near Bogibeel bridge. On that day, TMPK, MMK, and TMMK members of the Silapathar Town Committee also planted trees in the college premises. On the same day, an awareness campaign among the vegetable vendors of the Bhalukaguri Dambuk area near Bogibeel Bridge, along with students and teachers of Silapathar College, Silapathar, was conducted on June 5th, 2022, to create awareness among the people. (v) On the occasion of World Environment Day-2022, a total of 15 indigenous saplings were planted in and around the college campus by the Eco Club members and the students of the Sociology Department on June 5th, 2022, after the completion of an awareness meeting and plantation

drive at Silapathar Nagar LPS. As a result, on June 4th, 2022, the Science faculty planted trees on the college campus. A total of 8 plants were planted on the college premises. (w) On June 11th, 2022, the Department of Botany, Silapathar College visited Jaipur Reserve Forest to conduct field studies in order to fulfill the course requirements of B.Sc. 2nd and 4th semester. All the students of B.Sc. 2nd and 4th semester and faculty members were participated in the field study. (x) A DAY AT STUDENTS" HOME Faculties of the Department of Mathematics visited the homes of students of the department as a part of the outreach programme A Day at Students" Home" on 29/09/2021. The purpose of the programme is to understand the socio-economic conditions of their families and to take necessary measures if possible. (y) In commemorating 75 years of Independence Day in India, the NSS Unit of Silapathar College observed the event in a befitting manner. To mark the event, the NSS Unit of the College carried out a number of activities from August 11th, 2022 to August 15th, 2022. An awareness campaign on Har Ghar Tiranga was carried out at the adopted villages-Lakhipur Village, Kulajan Pam, and Silapathar. Twenty students participated in the said programme headed by Mr. Raju Pegu, Assistant Professor, IQAC Coordinator and Programme Officer of the NSS Unit of the College. A total of 85 houses were distributed National Flags, followed by an awareness campaign on the importance of celebrating Independence Day in India.
